#### What to Expect

**Emotional** - Inconsistent behavior patterns are common. A roller coaster of emotions can be true of boys and girls.

**Social** - Social interaction with peers becomes very important. Middle school students often begin to refer to peers as sources for standards.

**Spiritual** - Transformation from a childlike faith into a personal responsibility and commitment often begins during middle school years.

**Academic** - While grades are an important indication of where students are academically, grades alone may not tell the whole story in middle school.

- Gain independence as a thinker and a learner.
- Recognize failures and struggles as an opportunity for growth.
- Learn to use their voice.

Weather permitting, students will remain outside until 8:00 a.m. At 8:00 a.m., students will be allowed to go to their lockers and get ready for the day.

## **Late Work Policy**

### **Contact: Classroom Teacher**

- Beyond one class period late - 0

## **Gradebook codes will be as follows:**

- P (pending) - will be used to indicate a student has submitted an assignment, but the assignment has not been graded yet
- E (excused) - will be used to indicate that a certain assignment does not have to be completed by the student
- M (missing) - will be used to indicate that a student was present for class but did not turn in the assignment. A zero and note will be placed in the grade book explaining the reason for the zero plus due date for the assignment. The expectation is that students will have no missing assignments. Even if a student receives a zero because the assignment was three or more days late, students are still expected to complete the assignment.
- A (absent) - will be used to indicate that a student was absent from your class. You may also choose to use E or M in place of the A. Choose what tracking system works best for you.

Math classwork/homework is a completion grade of 10 points unless specified differently by the classroom teacher.
